For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.



5 TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JESUS' SURPRISING AND REVEALING CALL

This Sunday's Gospel tells us about how Jesus called Peter and some of his friends for their future work. The story is both surprising and revealing.

The crowds are all around Jesus at the Sea of Galilee because He is a popular teacher. On the shore, some fishermen are cleaning their nets. To avoid being pushed by the crowd, Jesus gets into Simon Peter's boat and moves a little away from the shore so He can speak to everyone.

After teaching, Jesus tells Peter to go out and fish. This is surprising because Jesus is a carpenter's son and not a fisherman. Peter knows that the conditions for fishing are not good. It is still daytime, and they had no luck fishing the night before. But Peter listens to Jesus and casts his nets anyway. This shows that Peter is willing to follow Jesus' guidance.

When Peter throws the nets in, they fill with so many fish that the boat starts to sink. Peter calls James and John for help. This catch is not normal; only someone sent by God could do this.

Overwhelmed by the miracle, Peter falls to his knees before Jesus and asks Him to go away. He feels unworthy to be near Jesus. Peter thinks that someone like Jesus, who is close to God, would not want to be with a sinner like him. This feeling of unworthiness is similar to how Isaiah felt in the First Reading.

What Peter doesn't realize is that admitting his sin is the first step. Jesus is calling Peter to help gather people and save them from the troubles of the world. Unlike catching fish, which are caught to be eaten, Peter will catch people and bring them to life.

From now on, Peter will not use boats and nets; instead, God's word will be his tool. The miraculous catch of fish shows that these wonders are invitations to help others. Jesus' call changes people's priorities. This was true for Peter then, and it is true for us today.

Your presence here makes all the difference.


