For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.

#### 8TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our Responsorial Psalm this Sunday, "Lord, it is good to give thanks to you. Psalm 92: 2a"; This simple statement reminds us of the importance of gratitude in our lives. When we take time to thank God for the blessings we have—our family, friends, health, and even the little things—we open our hearts to joy and positivity. Gratitude helps us see the good in our lives, even when things are tough.



In the Gospel of Luke 6: 43-45, Jesus teaches us something important about our hearts. He says that a good person brings forth good things from the goodness in their heart, while an evil person brings out evil from a heart filled with negativity. This tells us that what we keep in our hearts really matters.

Think about it: if we fill our hearts with love, kindness, and gratitude, those are the things that will come out in our words and actions. But if we let anger, bitterness, or negativity take over, that's what we'll express to the world.

So, how do we fill our hearts with goodness? One way is through prayer and reflection. When we take time to connect with God, we can ask for help to fill our hearts with His love. We can also practice gratitude by regularly thanking God for the good things in our lives. This shifts our focus from what we lack to what we have, and it helps us cultivate a positive attitude.

Let's also remember to surround ourselves with good influences—people who uplift us and inspire us to be better. When we fill our lives with goodness, it becomes easier to share that goodness with others.

Let's pray for the grace to be good people, letting the goodness in our hearts shine through our words and actions.
