For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick & Holy Communion are available upon request to those who are sick, elderly or homebound. Families are requested to call the Parish Office to arrange a visit. If urgent, you may call the office at St. Anne at 724-872-3555.

OCIA: Beginning this weekend, our Elect – Makenna and Marta – continue the Period of Purification and Enlightenment.

This period is "a more intense preparation of spirit and heart, which has the character of recollection rather than of catechesis and is intended to purify hearts and minds by examination of conscience and penitence" with the purpose of forming a deeper relationship with Christ the Savior. (OCIA,139) An integral aspect of this period is the celebration of the Scrutinies of the Elect. These Scrutinies will be held during the Eucharistic Celebration on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent. These rites include prayers of exorcism, prayers of uncovering and healing all that is weak and sinful and strengthening all that is upright, strong and good. God's Time and the Urgent Call for Conversion

In our Christian lives, we often look for examples of true conversion—people who have fully committed their lives to Jesus and turned away from sin. We can find inspiration in the stories of saints like St. Augustine and St. Ignatius of Loyola. However, it's important to remember that conversion requires our personal commitment to follow Jesus and resist temptation.

In today's Gospel, Jesus talks about the tragic deaths of some Galileans and a tower accident. The key point isn't whether their sins caused their deaths, but rather that we should not wait for death to catch us unprepared. Death can come at any moment, and we need to be ready. Conversion is urgent; it's about aligning our lives with God's will so that when we face death, it leads us to salvation rather than despair.

St. Paul reminds us that conversion should come from within us because God gives us the chance to change. Through baptism, we enter a special time of grace—our "burning bush moment"—where we encounter God's mercy and compassion. Like the gardener in the Gospel, God patiently gives us opportunities for conversion.

Lent is a time for us to reflect on our lives and prepare our hearts for the promise of resurrection.

Each day is an urgent call to embrace this promise. Let's not hide from God's call or delay our conversion. Instead, let's fill our lives with God's presence. While death will eventually come, it cannot separate our relationship with God. In a life of conversion, death is simply a doorway to eternal life with Him.

Your presence here makes all the difference.

OCIA - Order of Christian Initiation

The OCIA process involves a journey of faith and conversion. It is for anyone over 8 years of age. Those inquiring are introduced to the beliefs, life, liturgy, and apostolic work of the Catholic Church. OCIA is for the unbaptized, for the baptized who would like to receive Confirmation and Eucharist, and for those who just have questions. Sacrament of Marriage — Planning and Preparation
