

For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick & Holy Communion are available upon request to those who are sick, elderly or homebound. Families are requested to call the Parish Office to arrange a visit. If urgent, you may call the office at St. Anne at 724-872-3555.

OCIA: Beginning this weekend, our Elect – Makenna and Marta – continue the Period of Purification and Enlightenment.

This period is "a more intense preparation of spirit and heart, which has the character of recollection rather than of catechesis and is intended to purify hearts and minds by examination of conscience and penitence" with the purpose of forming a deeper relationship with Christ the Savior. (OCIA,139) An integral aspect of this period is the celebration of the Scrutinies of the Elect. These Scrutinies will be held during the Eucharistic Celebration on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent. These rites include prayers of exorcism, prayers of uncovering and healing all that is weak and sinful and strengthening all that is upright, strong and good. 

4 th Sunday of Lent

We focus on the first reading from 1 Samuel and the Gospel of John. Both readings teach us important lessons about seeing with God's eyes.

In the first reading, God sends the prophet Samuel to find a new king for Israel. Samuel looks at Jesse's sons and is impressed by their looks, but God tells him that He looks at the heart instead. God chooses David, the youngest son, to be king. This reminds us that what matters most is not how we look on the outside but what is in our hearts. God values our goodness and character.

In the Gospel, we see Jesus heal a man who was born blind. This miracle gives the man physical sight, but it also helps him see who Jesus really is—the Son of God. The Pharisees, who are proud and refuse to believe, remain blind to the truth. This shows us that Jesus is the light of the world. When we encounter Him, our lives can change for the better.

The key message from these readings is to look beyond appearances and see the goodness in ourselves and others. Just as God saw David's heart, we should try to see others through God's loving eyes. And like the blind man, we should be open to Jesus, allowing His light to guide us and transform our lives.

As we reflect on these stories, let's remember to focus on what is truly important: our hearts and our faith in Jesus, the light of the world.
